Join us for a three-part learning collaborative aimed toward anyone in Oregon and Southwest Washington who is interested in learning more about Rapid (Immediate) Initiation and Restart for HIV treatment, “Rapid Start.” Participants will gain access to subject matter experts to build a foundation for program success. They will also have the opportunity to receive direct technical assistance to support in Rapid Start implementation.

Immediate antiretroviral therapy (ART) or “Rapid Start” refers to the emerging standard of care in the management of HIV where ART is started as soon as possible after the diagnosis of HIV, preferably at the first clinic visit or at the time of diagnosis.^[resource]
